## **A Welcome to the Physicians of Japan**

**MEDICINE**, like all the sciences and all the arts, is international in its scope. But more so than any other discipline, medicine has served throughout history to unite the different parts of the world because of its aspirations for the betterment of mankind. In fact, throughout history there has always been a bond uniting doctors on an international scale for the exchange of knowledge and skills in the interest of health for all people anywhere. This has transcended national boundaries, political philosophies, social structures and cultural differences. On this plane of extending knowledge to help the sick of mankind, the influence of Japanese medical genius has been long appreciated internationally for the accomplishments of Japanese research. Japanese scientists have made many and great contributions to the fundamental sciences such as immunology, biochemistry and biophysics, the basic foundations upon which the structure of medicine is built.

**IN A WORLD** in which the scientific explosion is expanding knowledge at an ever increasing rate, more modern means of communication become essential to keep pace. Medical Tribune uses the newspaper concept to provide fast, accurate, complete international and local news of medicine for physicians throughout the world.
